ABSTRACT

This manual provides information on sawmills with production of less than 100 MBF per year, sawmills with production of more than 100 MBF, primary mills who will offer custom services to the smaller mills, and persons or firms who are willing to provide a custom service in any of the following areas: felling, bucking and skidding, kiln drying, planing, planting/reforestation and trucking.

The manual has been subdivided by forest section, and again by Rural Municipality or Local Government District within each section.

Appreciation goes to all persons who contributed information to make this manual possible. Their contribution is gratefully acknowledged.

Thanks also are extended to all the Natural Resource Officers, staff of Manitoba Natural Resources Forestry Branch, Agricultural Representatives, Secretary-Treasurers and Resident Administrators of the RMs and LGDs, non-governmental and governmental organizations involved with forestry, woodlot, shelterbelt planning and related programs for all the assistance given in helping us locate sawmills or persons/firms involved in the forest industry.

Our purpose in producing this manual is to assist the business ventures of rural Manitobans involved in forest production, and those who service producers. Rural development requires the wise use of not only our natural resources, but also our human resources. By making everyone interested in private land and small scale forest operations aware of the services available, we hope to allow contact among all parties, and improvement in business transactions. At the same time, knowledge of governmental and private programs will assist private citizens in the timely and appropriate use of available resources with which to manage our forest.

PROVINCIAL SUMMARY

This Manitoba Woodland Services Manual is the third in a series of publications relating to forest-based industries in Manitoba. The Directory of Primary Wood-Using Industries in Manitoba - 1991 reviewed the major forest product producers in the province. It summarizes each operation, providing mill location, ownership, capacity, production, employment, wood supply, products, markets, equipment, and factors limiting present operation and expansion. Sawmills, planing mills, wood treating plants, other miscellaneous wood-using industries and pulp, paper and fibreboard mills are grouped by industry type, size of operation, and forest region.

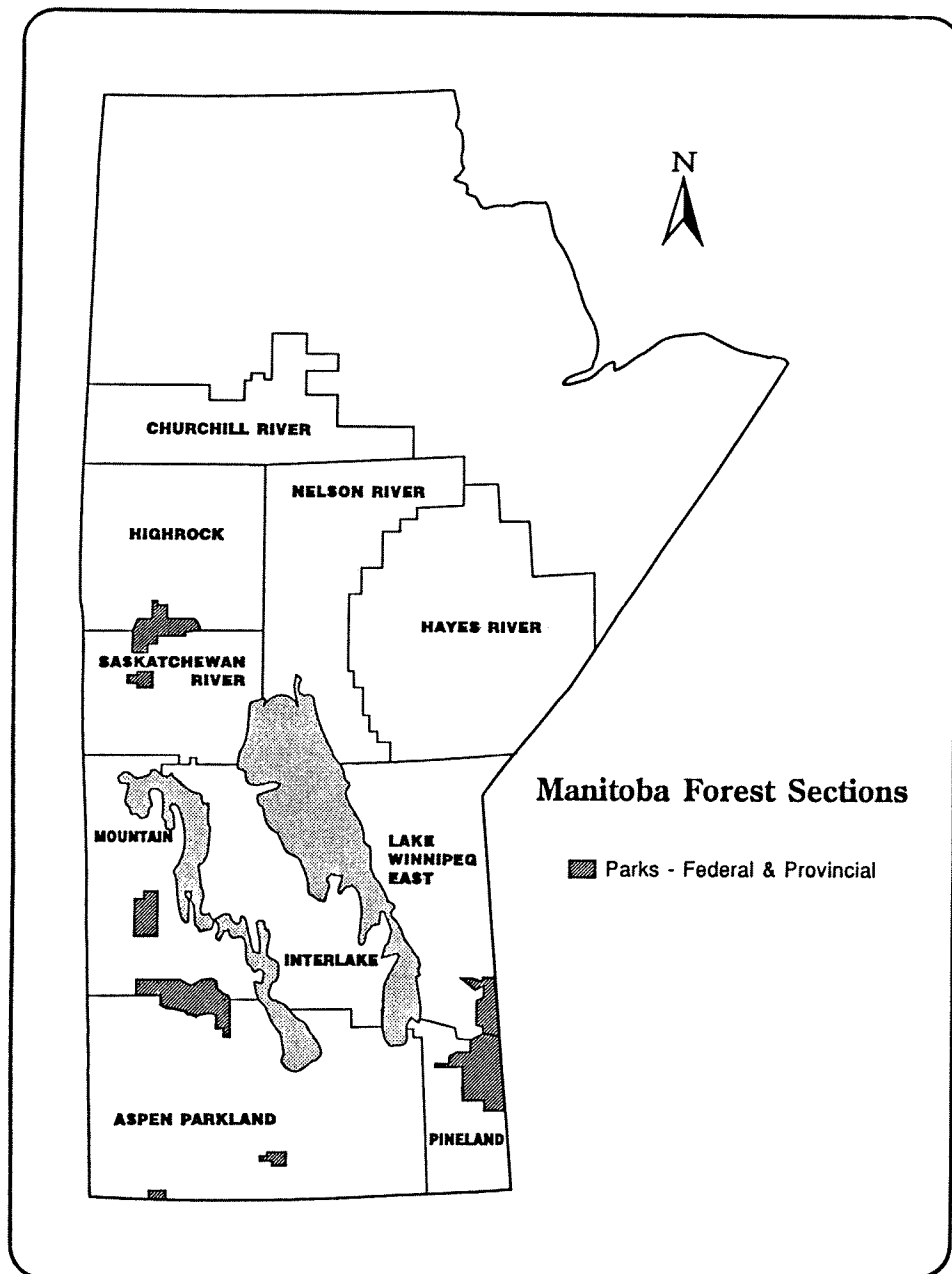
The Directory of Secondary Wood-Using Industries in Manitoba - 1991 provides information on Manitoba firms that secondarily process wood. The Directory provides the location, telephone number, facsimile number, executive officer, number of people employed and a priority products listing for each firm. Firms are classified into the 21 Standard Industrial Classifications (SIC) codes used by Statistics Canada.

This manual investigates the smaller sawmills scattered throughout Manitoba, and reviews the larger mills that provide custom services. Businesses that offer felling, bucking and skidding, kiln drying, logging, planing and planting and reforestation services are listed. Finally, trucking companies that are interested in moving product are presented.

Lumber Consumption by Secondary Sawyers in Manitoba, 1993

The amount of board feet produced by secondary (small <100 MBF) sawmills in the 10 Forest Sections in rural Manitoba (Figure 1) is summarized in Figure 2. A total of 17,098,010 board feet of 16 different species of hardwoods and softwoods were utilized in 1993. Of this, 10,364,930 board feet (61 percent) was softwood and 6,733,080 board feet (39 percent) was hardwood. White spruce (38 percent) and Jack Pine (17 percent) are the dominant softwoods, and Trembling Aspen (28 percent) is the major hardwood. Combined, these three species comprise 82 percent of all lumber consumption.

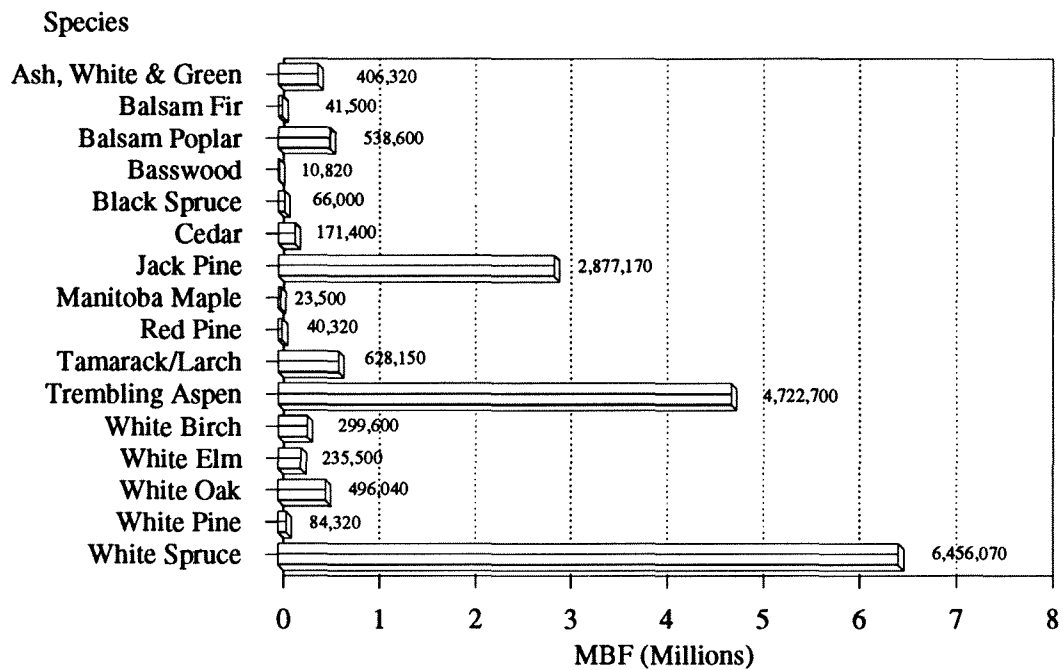

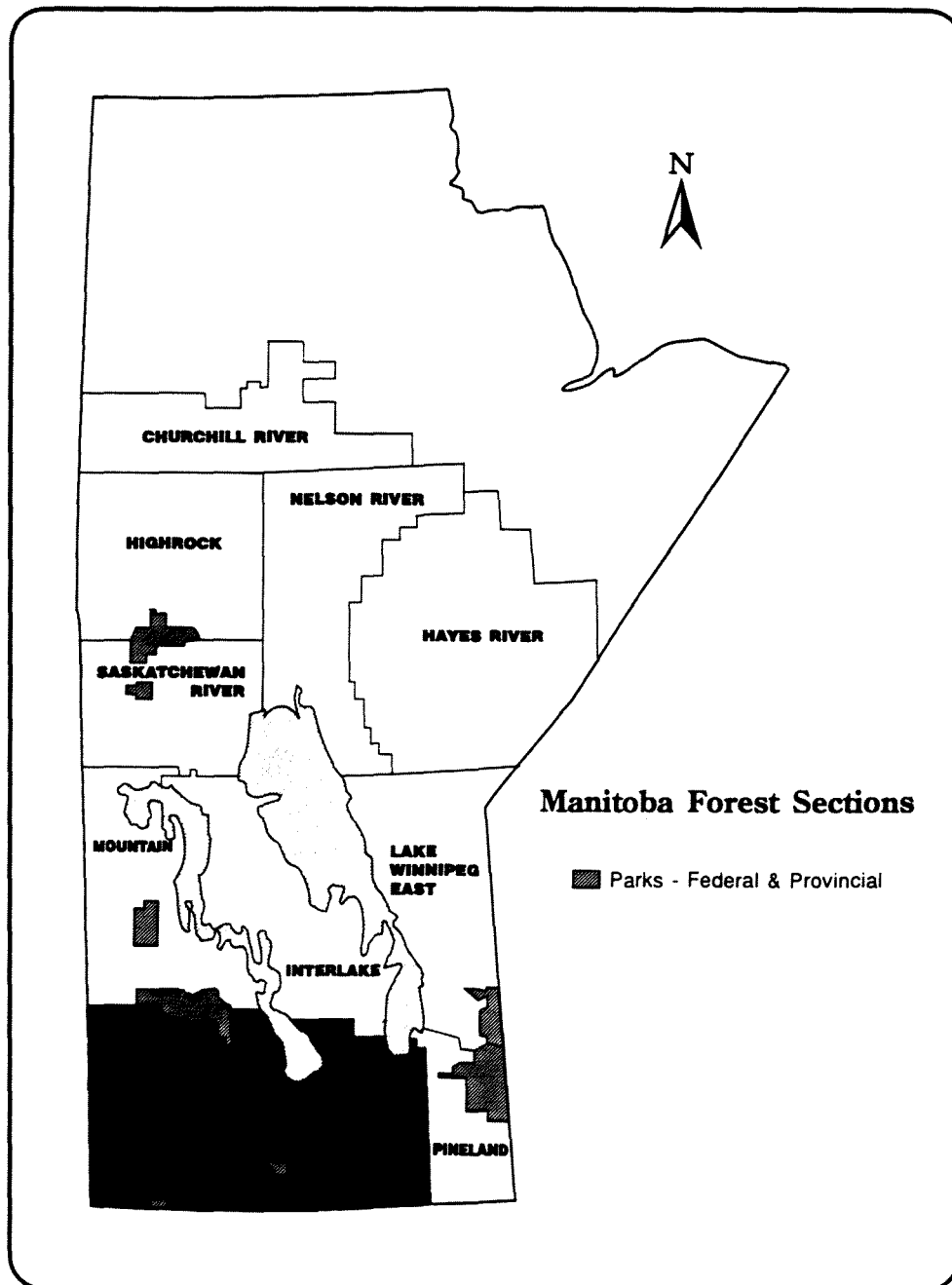

FOREST SECTION - ASPEN PARKLAND



ASPEN PARKLAND FOREST SECTION

The Aspen Parkland Forest Section has a well developed service sector for potential use by private landowners. Nineteen sawmills, six custom felling, bucking and skidding services, three kiln driers, three planers, five planting or reforestation services, and 18 trucking services are distributed throughout the region.

A total of 2,536,670 board feet of 15 different species of trees was processed in the region in 1992-93 (Figure 3). Softwoods and hardwoods are presented equally in the harvest, with white spruce (34 percent) and jack pine (9 percent) as the dominant softwoods, and white oak (19 percent), ash (11 percent), aspen (9 percent) and elm (9 percent) as the major hardwoods.

Forest Section, 1993**

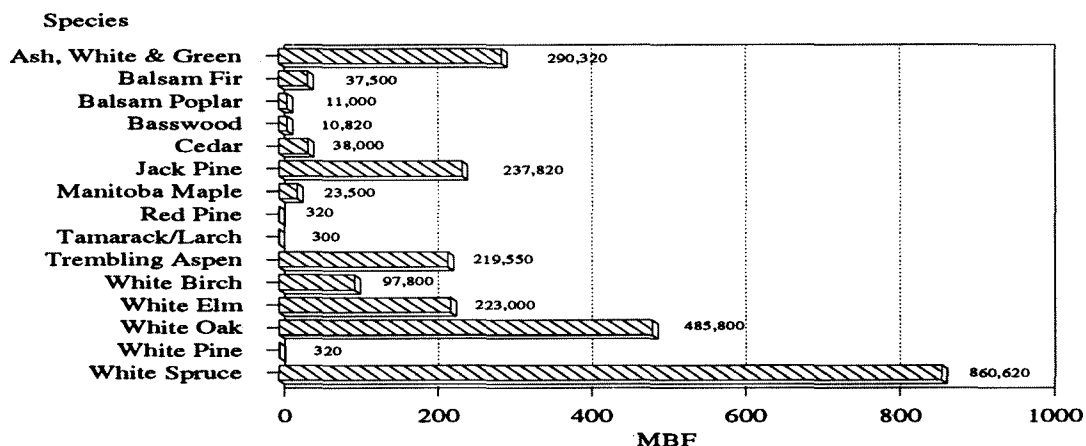
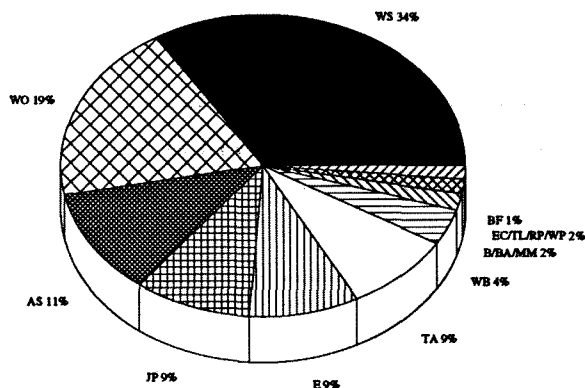

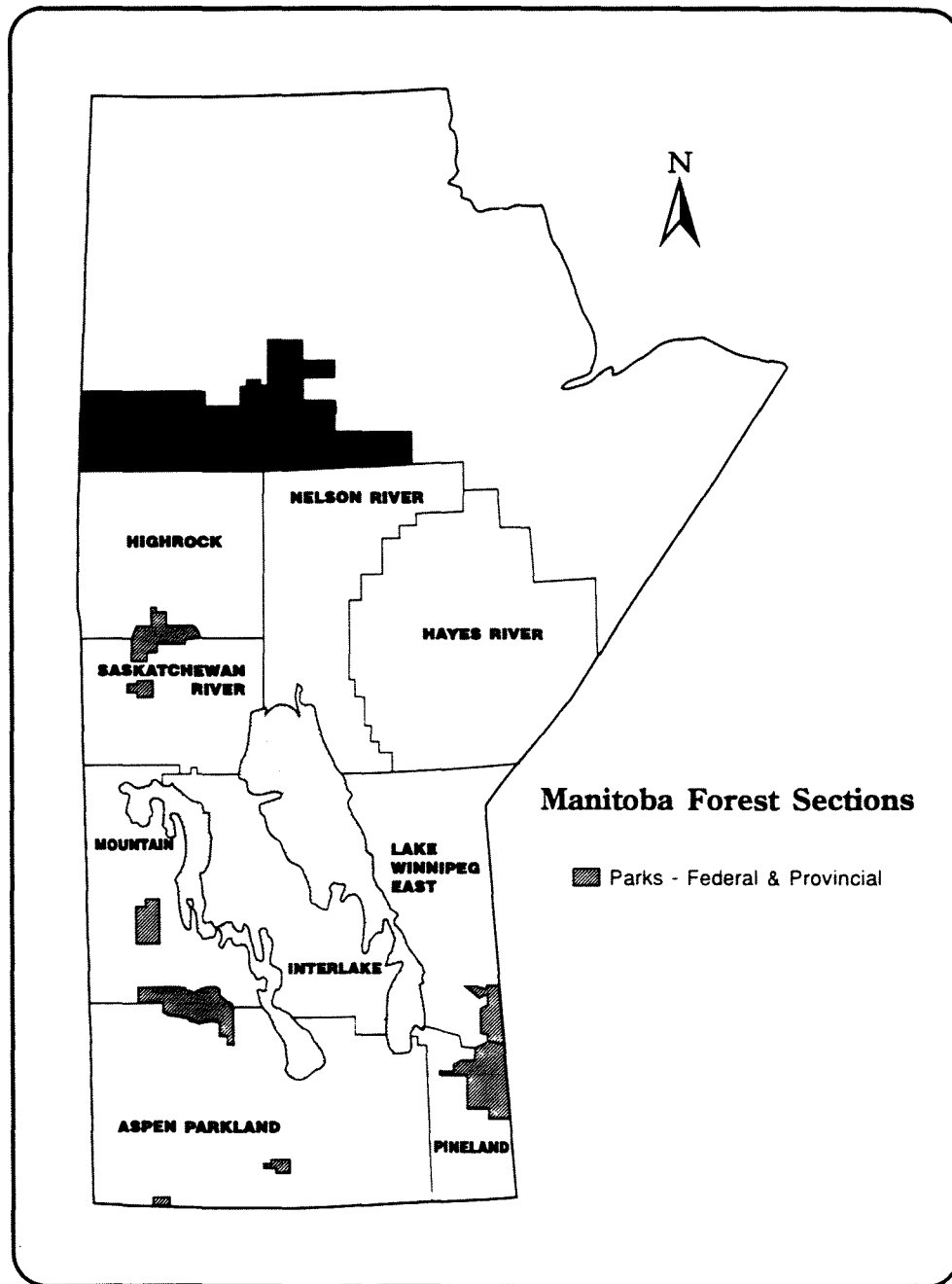

This section is the furthest north in the province, and only one sawmill was located within the region. Production in 1992-93 totalled 50,000 board feet. Three-fourths of the timber cut was jack pine and one-quarter was white spruce (Figure 6).

Forest Section, 1993**

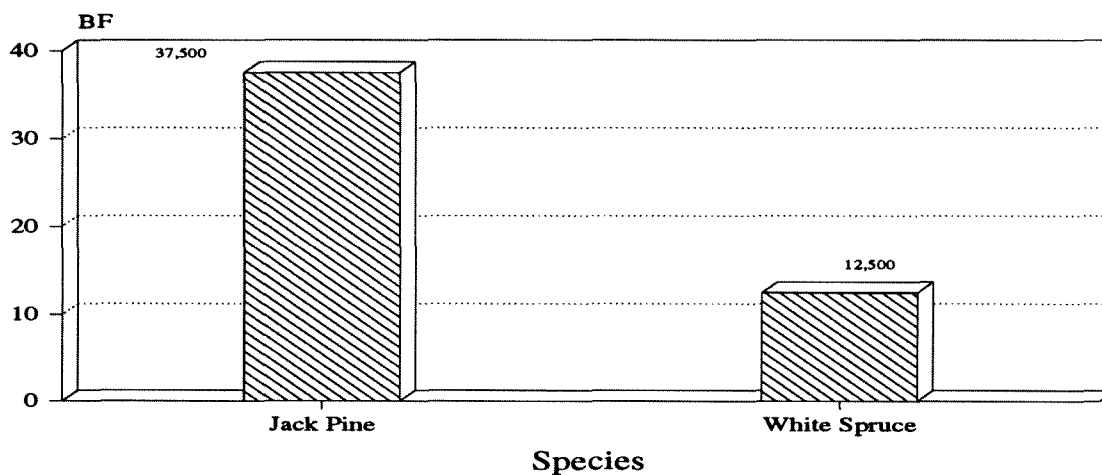
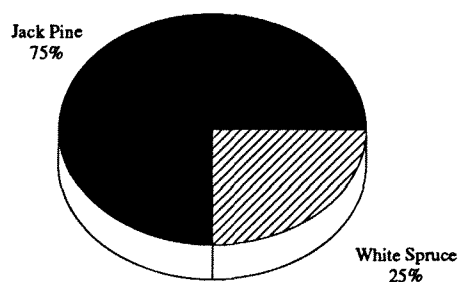

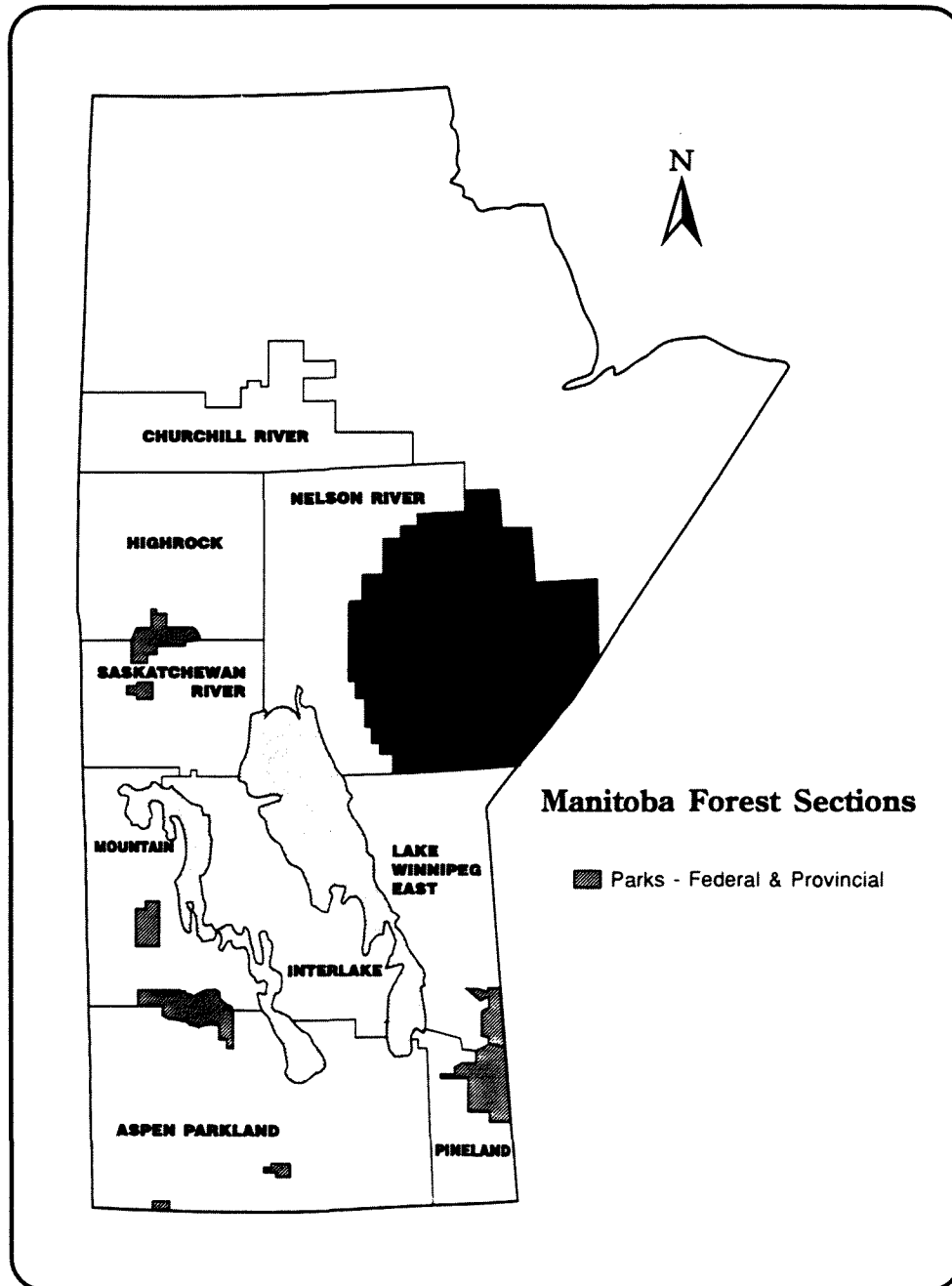
**Percentage of total lumber consumption

Forest Section, 1993**

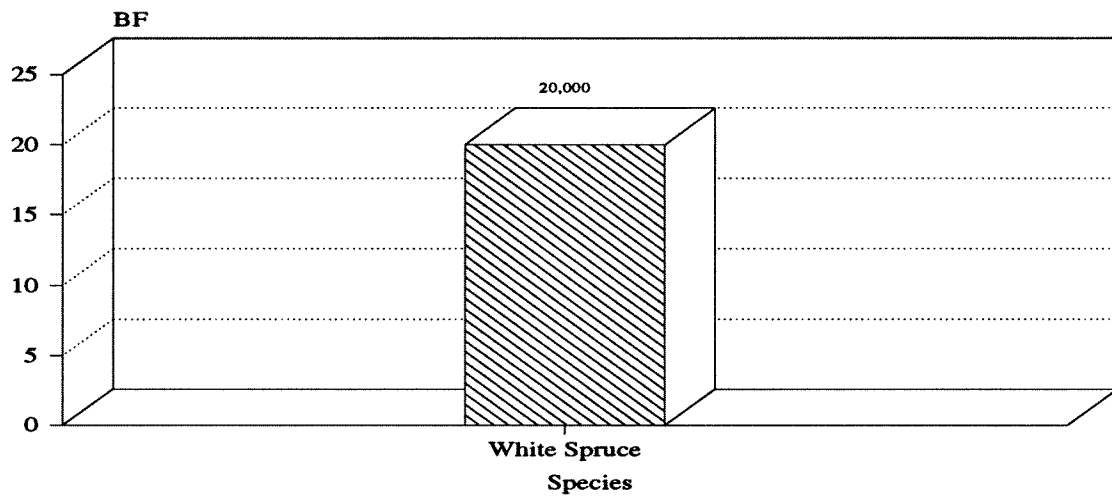
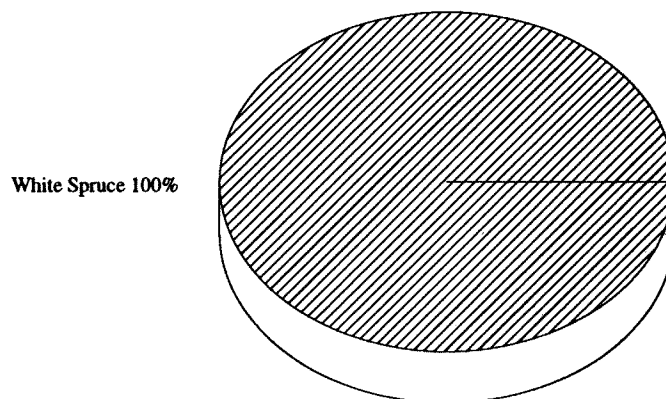

Hayes River Forest Section, 1993**



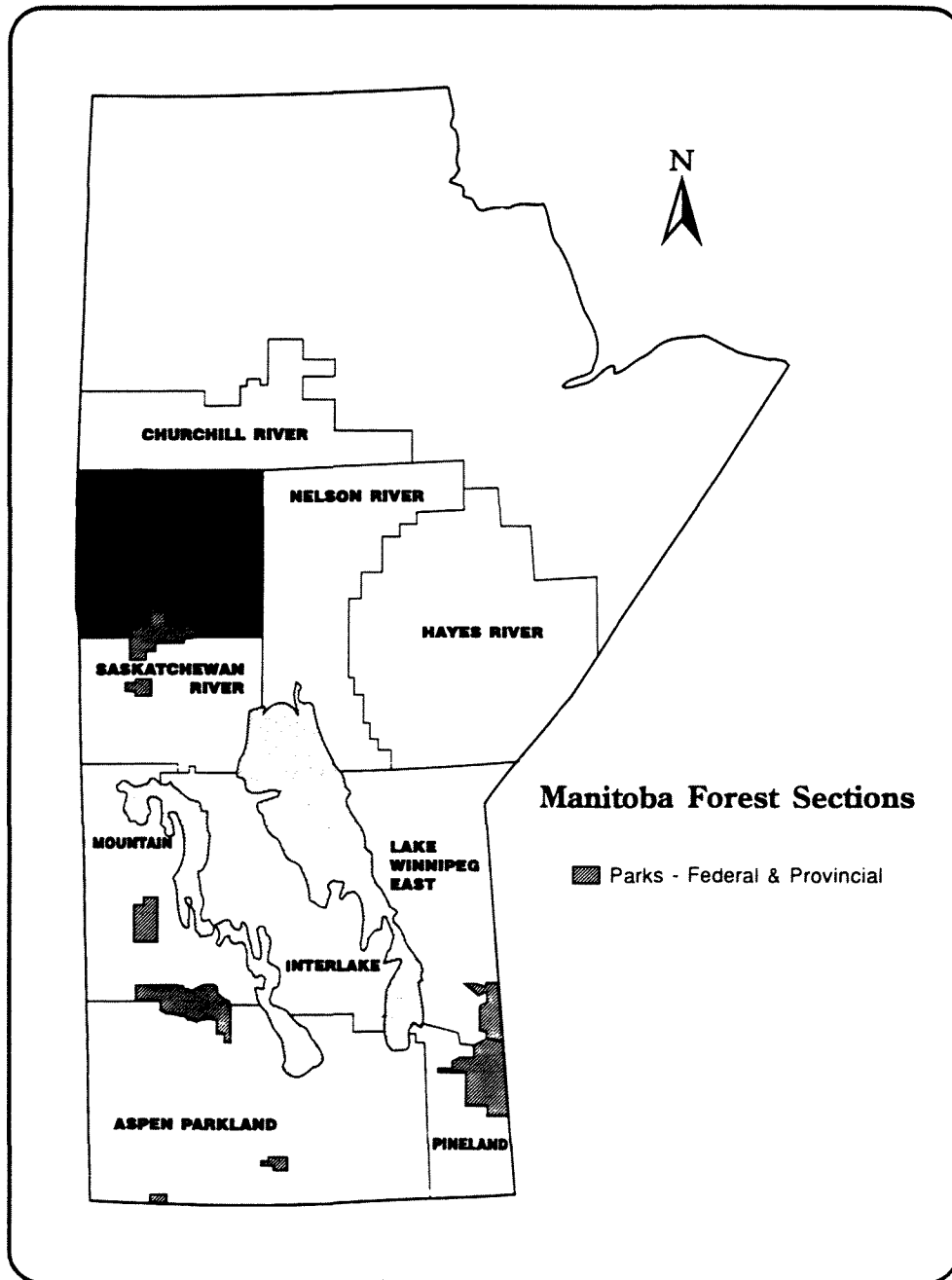

Forest Section, 1993**

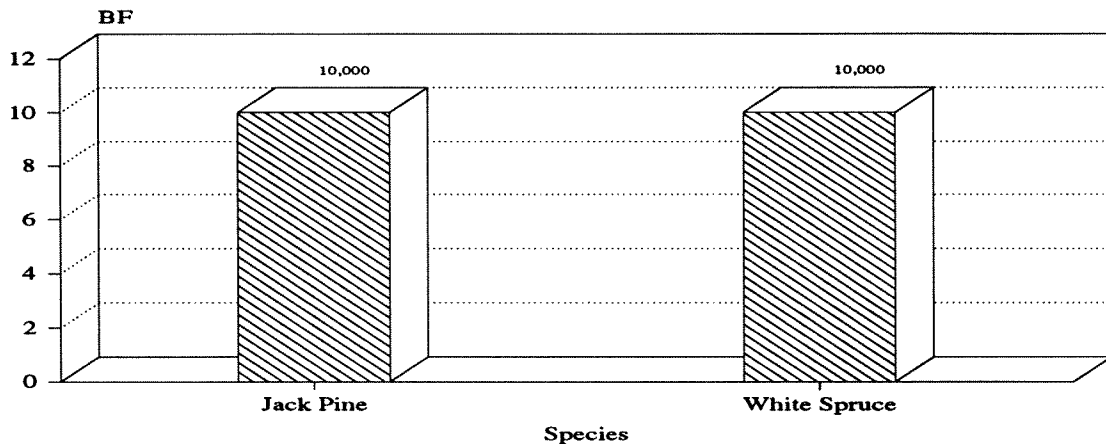
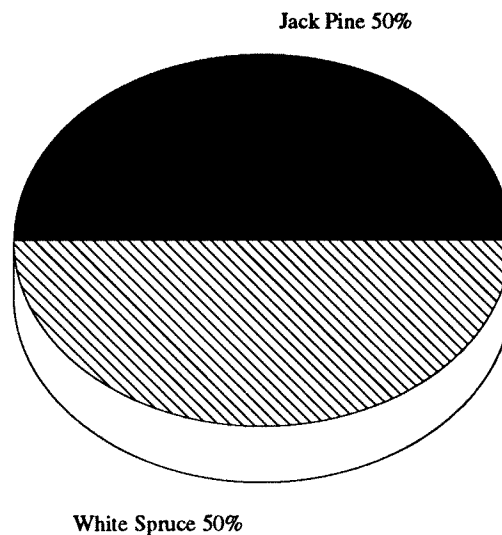

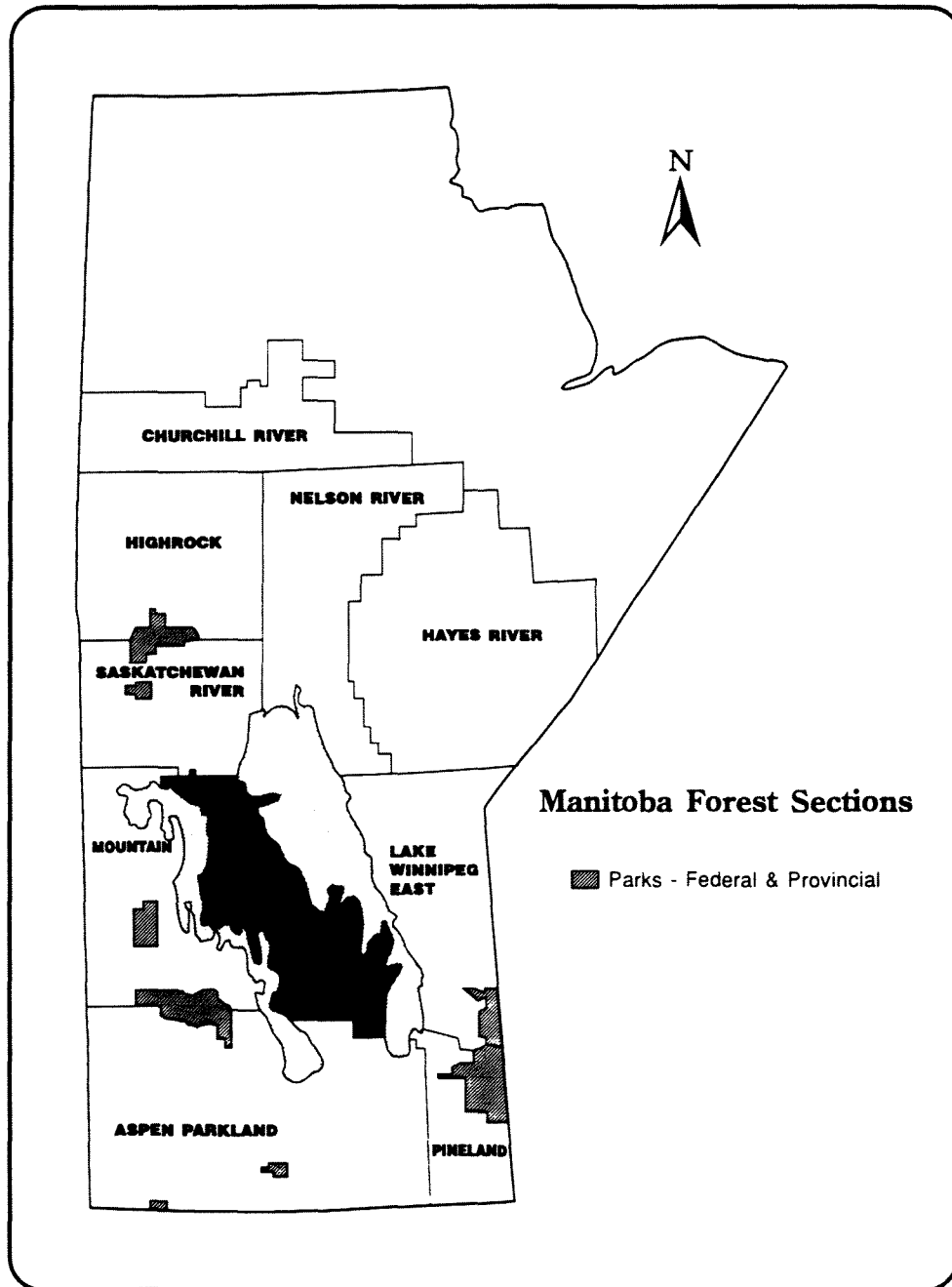

INTERLAKE FOREST SECTION

Seventeen sawmills offer custom services in the Interlake region. There also are six felling, bucking, skidding services, five planers, two reforestation operations, and three local trucking firms willing to haul forest products.

Total production in 1993 was 2,324,590 board feet. White spruce comprised 65 percent of all production, and softwood totalled 90 percent. Trembling aspen and balsam poplar are the only two hardwoods of significance (Figures 11 & 12).

Section, 1993

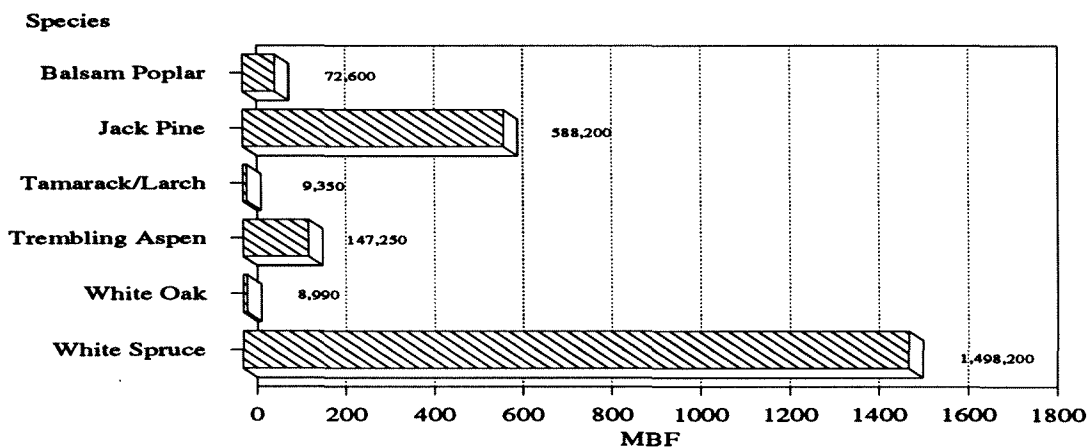
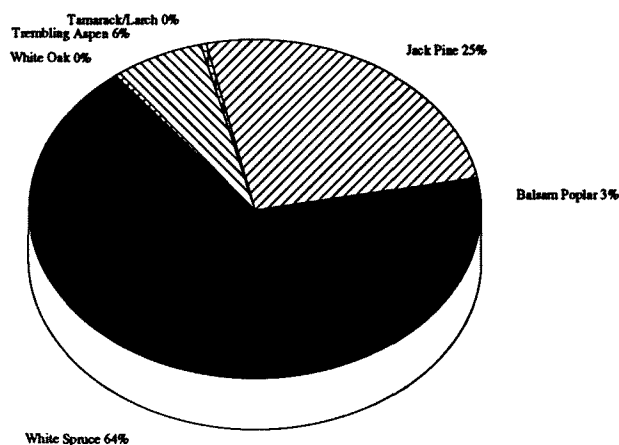

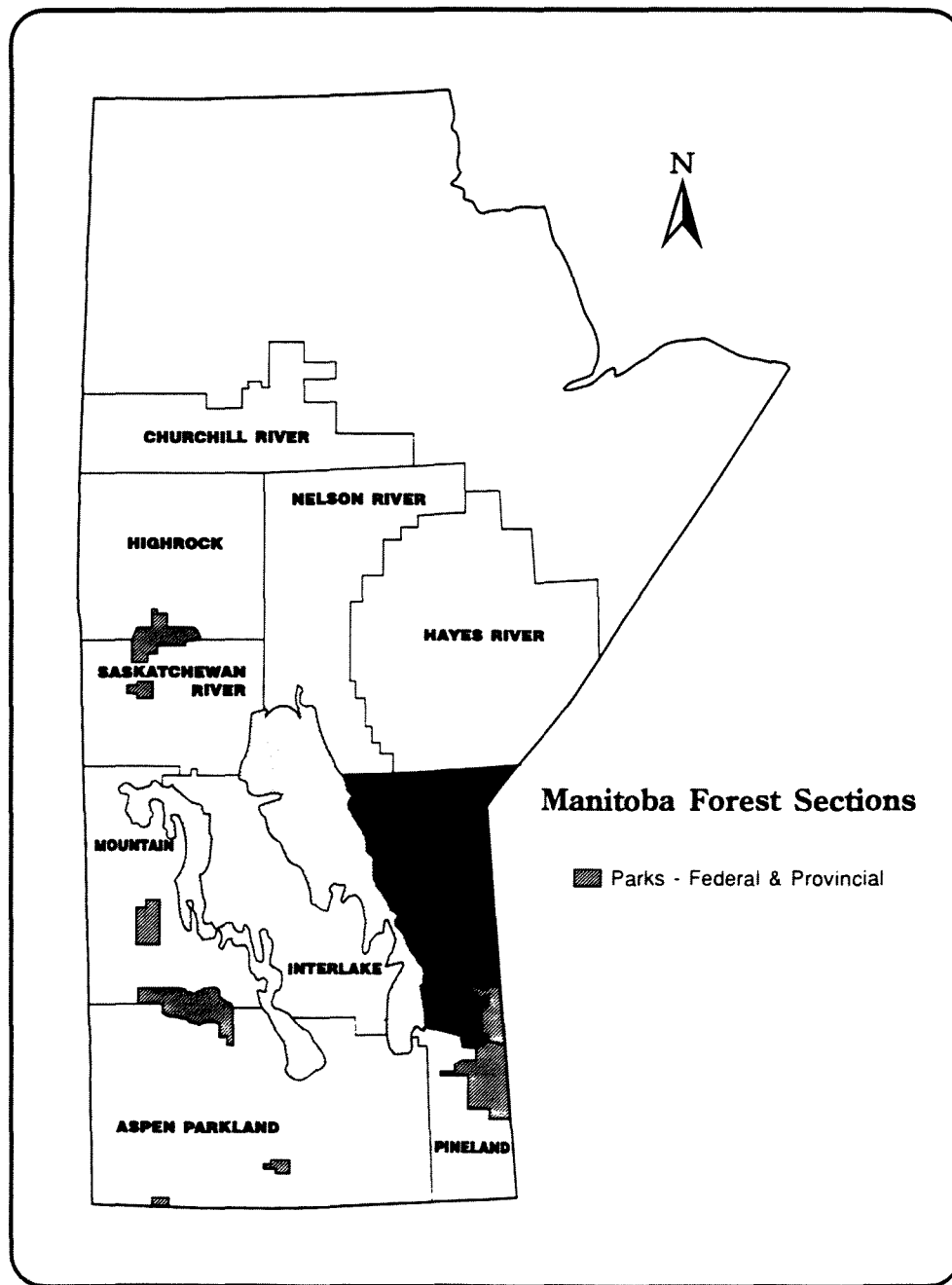

Forest Section, 1993

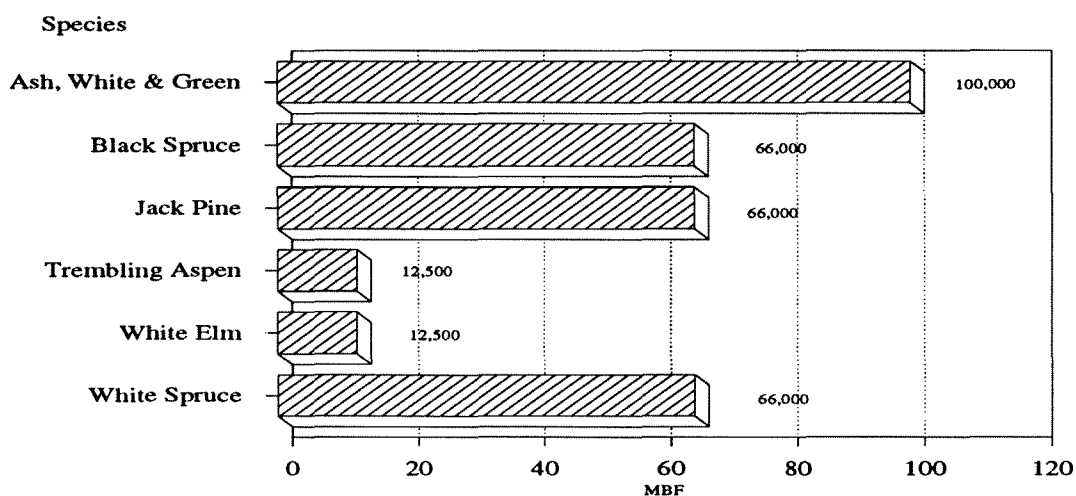
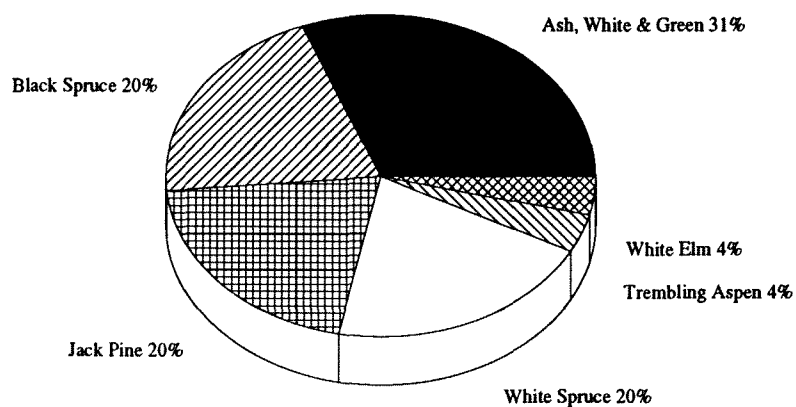

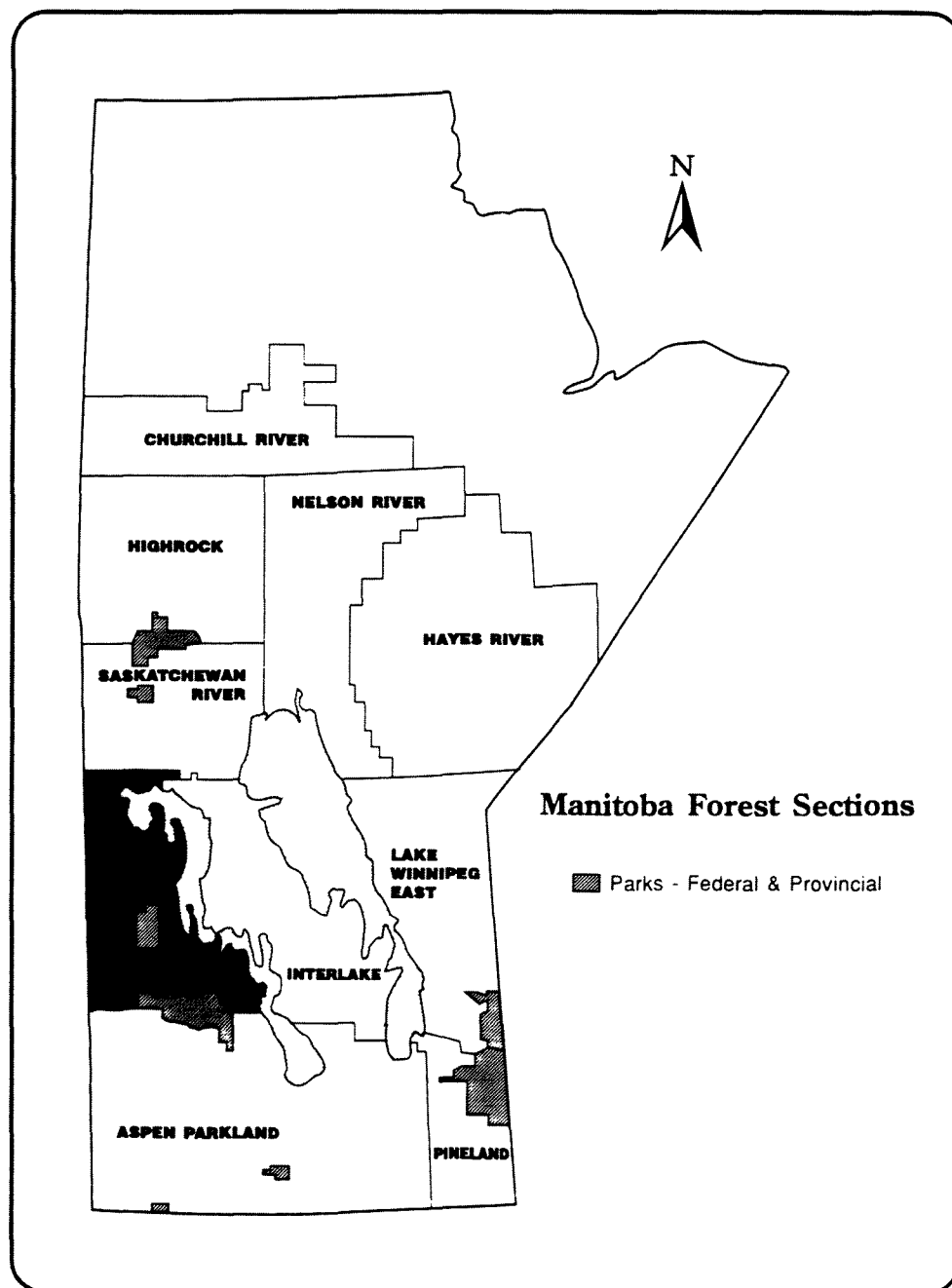

Section, 1993

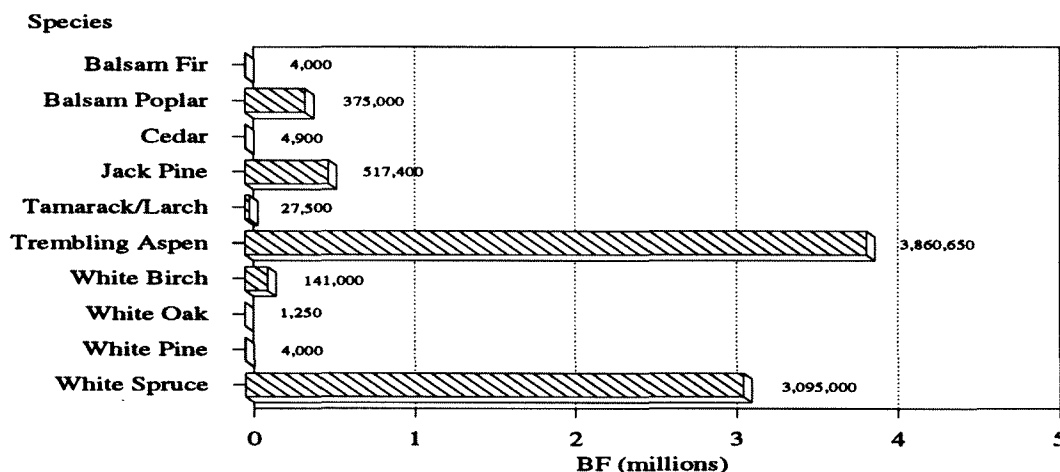
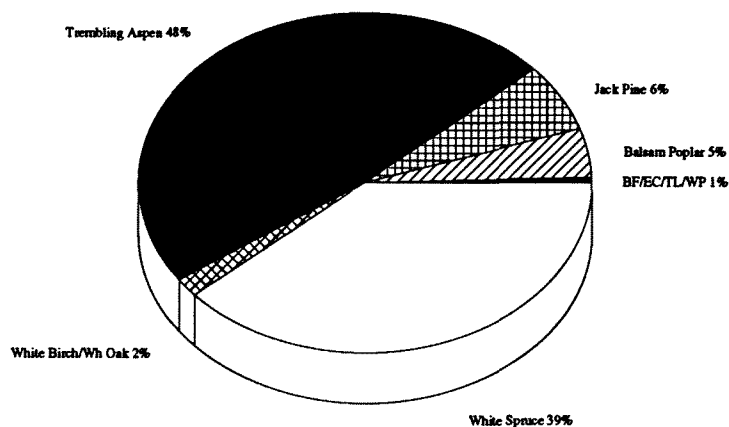

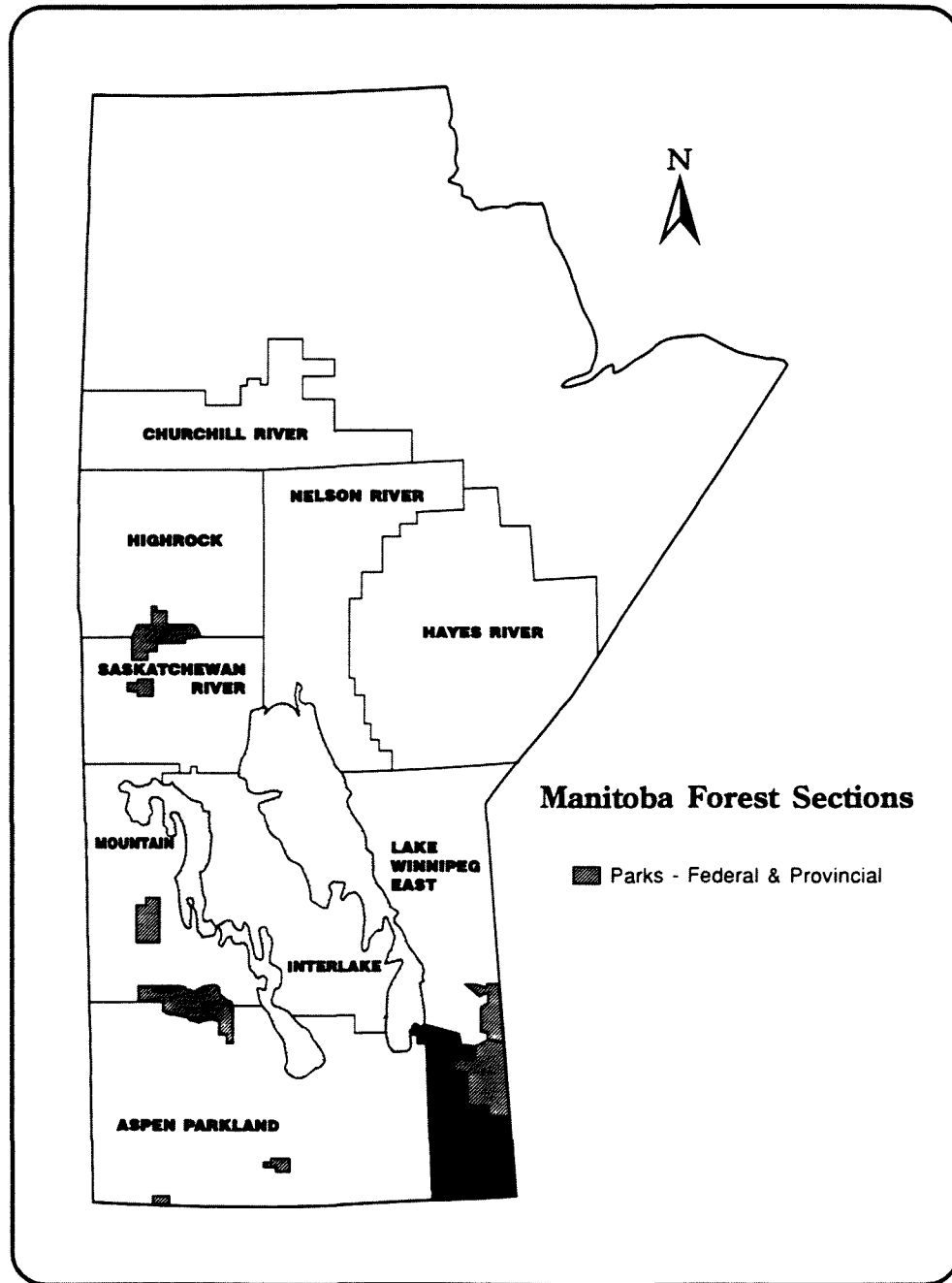

This section has a number of custom services for private woodlot management. Thirteen sawyers, seven felling, bucking, skidding services, one planer, and twelve trucking services are available. A total of 3,409,300 board feet of forest products was produced in 1993. More than 80 percent of production involves softwoods, with jack pine (44 percent), white spruce (13 percent) and tamarack (20 percent) as the major species. Trembling aspen is the only significant hardwood (Figures 17 & 18).

Section, 1993**

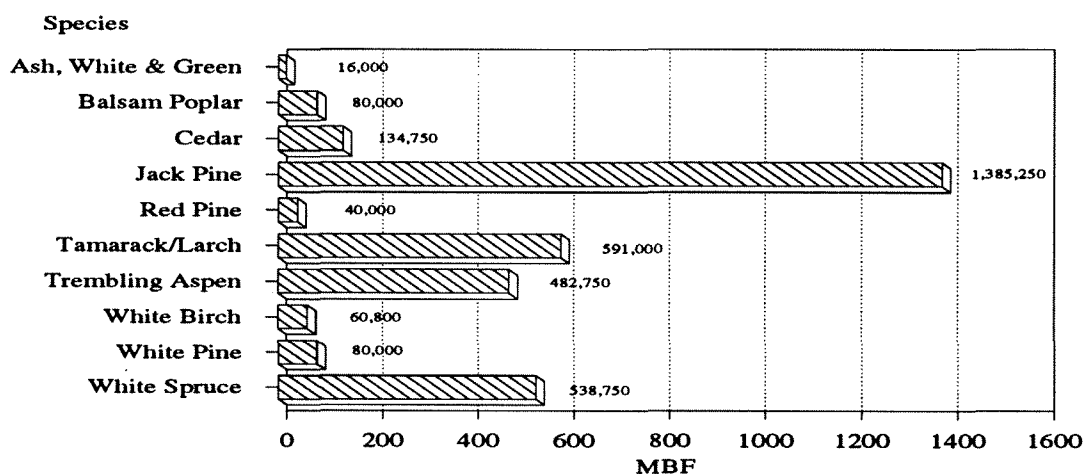
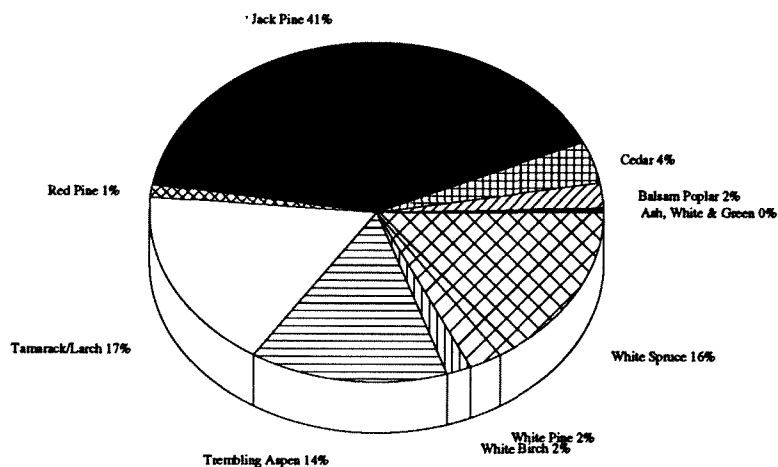

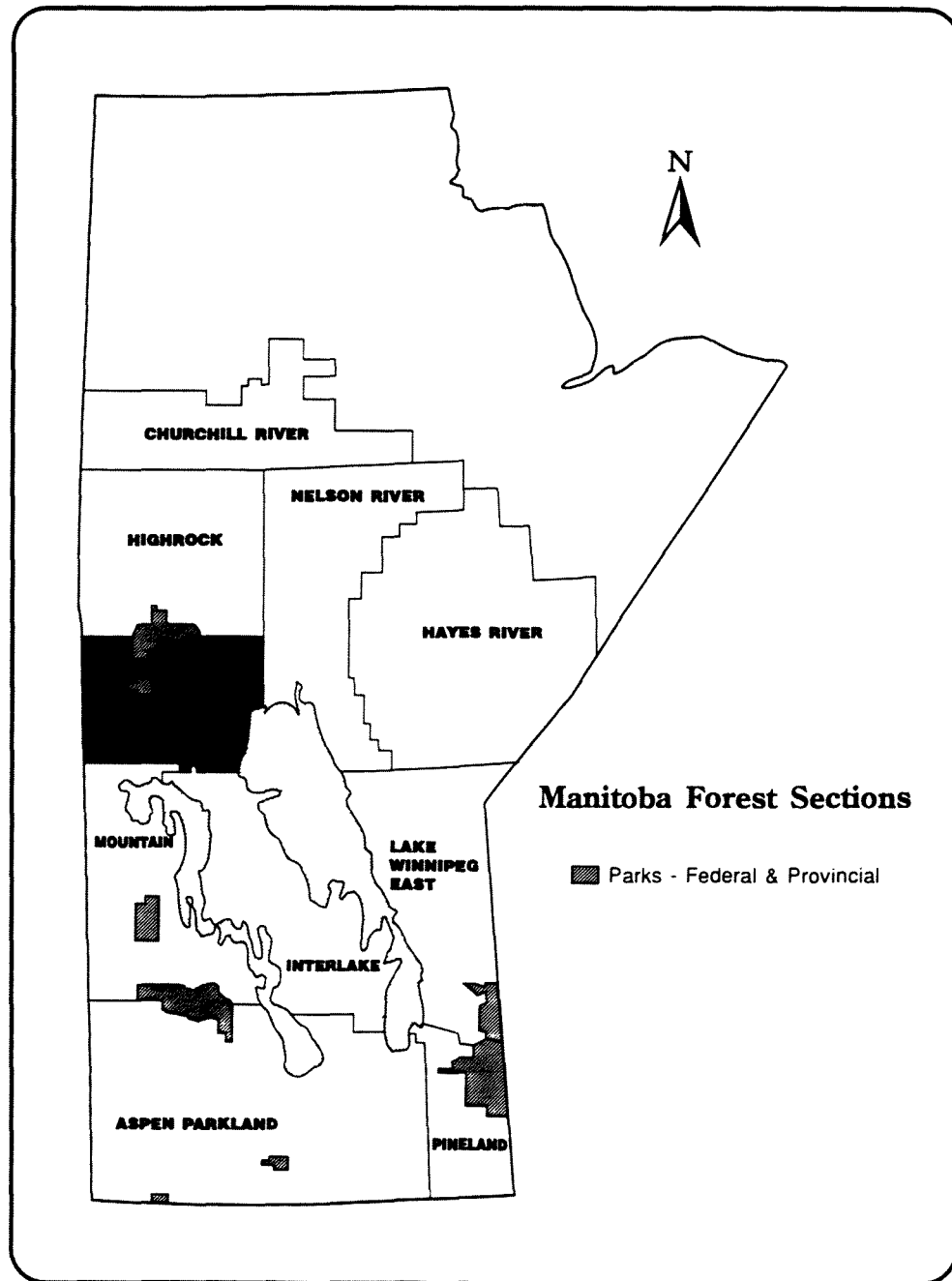

River Forest Section, 1993**

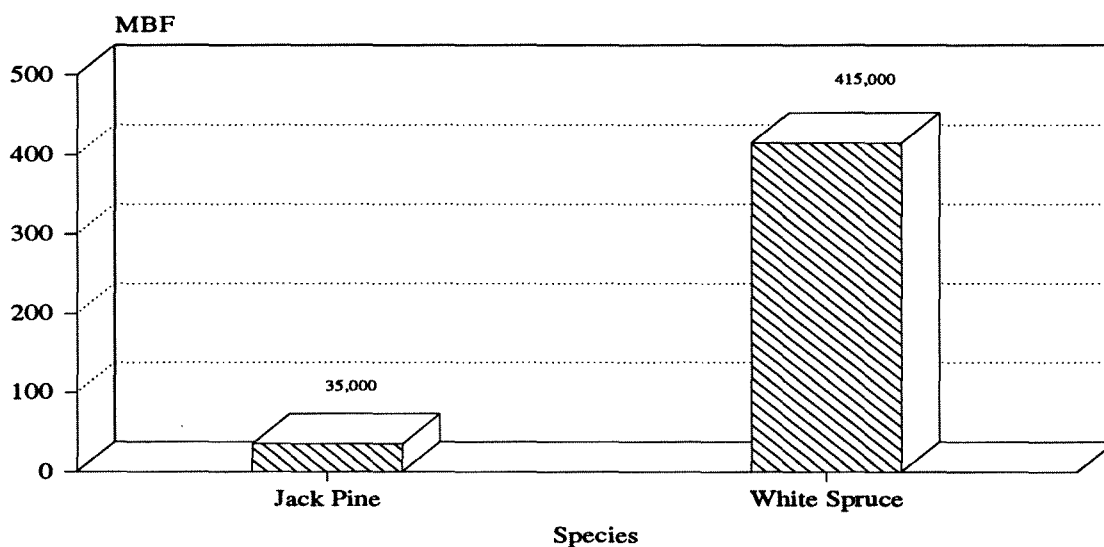
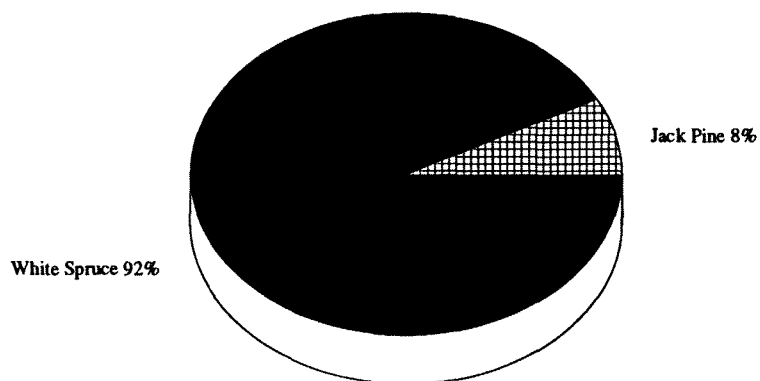

GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS

CANADIAN FOREST SERVICE

Canadian Forest Service works in partnership with the Province through the Canada-Manitoba Partnership Agreement in Forestry. They are associated with Tree Plan Canada, the Woodlot Association of Manitoba and the Manitoba Agro Woodlot Program (Manitoba Habitat Heritage Corporation). Canadian Forest Service addresses Private Land Forests in sub-program A.3. of the Partnership Agreement. The following excerpts are taken from sub-program A.3.

Manitoba's private forests represent 7% of Manitoba's productive forest lands. The private forest resource offers many opportunities for both existing forest industries and for expansion and diversification of the forest industry base.

The private forest resource is at an early developmental stage. Presently no formalized program exists in Manitoba. To ensure the opportunities presented can be met, the integrated Program will include the following sections:

- a) Public Information and Extension;
- b) Sectoral Development Projects;
- c) Management Assistance.

Projects under this Sub-program will include preparation of management plans; management incentives such as assistance for conducting silviculture treatments; development of non-traditional forest products (Christmas trees, maple syrup, etc.); traditional market identification; and preparation and delivery of suitable technology transfer products.

The specific goals in development of the private forest include: active management on over 200 woodlots, completion of up to 4 000 ha of silvicultural treatments subject to the availability of funding; increased economic activity in the marketing of both traditional and non-traditional forest products; a functioning woodlot owner organization(s); creation of a generic understanding and awareness of the resource; and the integration and involvement of other sectors including agriculture, wildlife and fisheries into the development of the resource.

GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS

TREE PLAN CANADA

Tree Plan Canada will consider assistance to proposals which:

- 1) use seedlings and/or small trees that are capable of being planted by hand;
- 2) do not have an industrial or commercial purpose; and,
- 3) are accompanied by the required authorizations and/or permits to proceed, if applicable.

It should be noted that the majority of funds available are for the seedling category. If a project does not meet the above requirements, one may wish to discuss the project further by contacting the nearest Canadian Forest Service office.

Once an application form is completed, forward it to the nearest Canadian Forest Service office. The degree of financial assistance considered will be based on an evaluation of the proposal according to the following criteria:

1. The Environmental Benefits Provided

Tree planting projects under Tree Plan Canada must contribute towards environmental benefits, for example, watershed protection, site reclamation, soil erosion control or energy benefits by providing shade and windbreaks around homes and buildings.

2. The Potential for Successful Implementation

The project, including the tree care and maintenance component, must be technically sound. Technical advice is available under the program to assist partners in developing and implementing their projects. To find out more about this service, partners can contact the nearest Canadian Forest Service office.

3. The Extent of Commitment as a Partner

Tree Plan Canada's assistance is based on the extent of the contribution (cash and/or in kind) provided by the applicant and/or other sources and the degree of tree care and maintenance provided after planting.

4. The Cost-Effectiveness of the Proposal

Tree Plan Canada's assistance will be targeted to those projects which are cost-effective and for which program assistance will be put to the wisest and best use.

5. The Level of Community Involvement

Projects which demonstrate community involvement, public education and awareness will be given priority.

Once a proposal is evaluated, Tree Plan Canada may provide a financial contribution towards tree purchase and tree planting costs up to a maximum of \$0.50 per seedling or \$8.00 per small tree.

Contributions normally will be on an equal cost-shared basis.

GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS

PRAIRIE FARM REHABILITATION ADMINISTRATION

The Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Administration (PFRA) provides a variety of services to rural landowners. Many of their programs relate to provision of rural water development on an individual, community, group or regional basis. These may relate indirectly to a woodlot program.

Of most direct concern to rural landowners is the PFRA Shelterbelt Centre. The Shelterbelt Centre provides tree and shrub seedlings as well as technical services (free of charge) to eligible applicants in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and the Peace River area in British Columbia. Trees are supplied free of charge but transportation costs must be paid by the applicant. Seedlings are shipped to the closest Agricultural Representative office or Rural Service Centre in the spring, usually late April to mid-May.

The following are eligible for tree and shrub seedlings:

- 1) Bonafide farmers and producers of primary agricultural products.
- 2) Owners of rural small holdings (0.4 - 16 ha) are eligible to receive the following material:
 - a) In Manitoba - caragana, Manitoba maple, green ash
 - b) In Saskatchewan - caragana, Manitoba maple, green ash, Siberian elm
- 3) Federal and provincial departments for planting on public, private or Crown lands for conservation, reclamation or research purposes.
- 4) Villages, towns and cities are eligible to receive caragana, Manitoba maple, green ash, villosa lilac and Siberian elm (except Manitoba).
- 5) Charitable organizations (such as 4-H, Scouts) for plantings on land serving the public without charge.
- 6) Indian band councils and individuals for plantings on reserves.

All applicants must specify the exact planting locations, certify that the plants will not be moved, sold or given to another party and authorize PFRA staff to inspect the planted trees at any reasonable time. All applications are subject to approval based on the requirements stated and may be refused at the discretion of the Department. While every effort is made to supply eligible applicants with the species and number of plants requested, distribution is made on a first-come, first-serve basis, and certain species are occasionally unavailable. In such cases, the Centre makes the best substitution possible.

TECHNICAL SERVICES

Planning assistance for farmers

On request, and subject to staff availability, technical staff will visit sites of eligible applicants in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, recommend effective shelterbelt plantings and advise on tree planting and maintenance. If required, a planting plan will be prepared during the winter and sent to the farmer for use during spring planting.

Planning assistance for federal, provincial and municipal agencies

Subject to staff availability, technical staff will provide assistance for conservation, reclamation and other special plantings. If required, detailed planting plans will be prepared.

GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS - PFRA CON'T

Public meetings and displays

The Shelterbelt Centre will provide speakers to make presentations to farmers and other interested groups. Topics include farm, field and roadside shelterbelts; conservation and wildlife plantings; species; planting designs and maintenance practices. An indoor display can be made available for fairs and other agricultural events.

Tours

Guided tours of the Shelterbelt Centre for organized groups are conducted Monday through Friday from Spring to Fall. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Literature

A variety of technical literature is available on request. Topics include: a description of species; weed control; planning; planting and care of shelterbelts; pruning; soil erosion; pest control; field, farmstead and wildlife plantings.

GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS

MANITOBA HABITAT HERITAGE CORPORATION

The Manitoba Habitat Heritage Corporation (MHHC) is the agency offering the Manitoba Agro Woodlot Program. MHHC has a history of working closely with many land and water conservation partners. These initiatives have a common goal: a diverse rural landscape capable of sustaining lands, water and wildlife resources for the rural communities that depend upon them. The MHHC Woodlot Technicians have the information and an understanding of the programs that can help farmers sustain their land resources. The program partners include Canadian Forest Service, Manitoba Natural Resources, Wildlife Habitat Canada, Tree Plan Canada, PFRA, and Farming for Tomorrow.

Trees are an important part of the Manitoba rural landscape. They are one of the resources that can contribute to the long-term viability of the land. In a changing world, woodlots may hold the potential to diversify and supplement family incomes. By broadening the economic base of landowners and rural communities, woodlots can contribute to increased rural self-sufficiency. The target area for programs is south-central and south-western Manitoba.

The Agro Woodlot Program will help landowners and communities explore new products and market opportunities, ranging from gourmet mushrooms to methanol production. The following programs are offered to landowners:

Woodlot Management Plan - Woodlot technicians are available to help prepare your woodlot management plan. The process begins with a visit to your property to discuss your goals, evaluate your site and develop a plan suited to your needs. Your Woodlot Management plan identifies a schedule of activities, costs and incentives that may be available. Your goals may include planting trees or managing an existing woodlot for:

- 1) wildlife habitat
- 2) fuel wood
- 3) lumber
- 4) outdoor recreation
- 5) nature trails
- 6) soil conservation
- 7) natural foods.

Once the plan is in place the Woodlot Technician continues to provide advice and support.

Incentives Available - Your Woodlot Technician can explain the various funding incentives that may be available to help complete your woodlot management plan.

Woodlot Extension Services - Woodlot Technicians may be able to provide assistance in such areas as identifying diseases and insects on your trees. They also can provide advice on new programs and economic opportunities, and speak to community groups.

WOODLOT ASSOCIATION OF MANITOBA (WAM)

WAM is a non-profit organization dedicated to the enhancement of Manitoba's private woodlot resource. It has two goals:

- 1) To enhance public awareness of private land forestry, and the benefits from a natural, environmental and economic standpoint.
- 2) To provide for the sustainable development of the private forest resource, and to enhance the socio-economic and environmental values inherent in Manitoba's private woodlands.

If you are a forest products user, woodlot owner, shelterbelt owner, or are interested in the conservation of Manitoba's natural resources, you are eligible to join. As a member you will be promoting active stewardship of Manitoba's private woodlands. You also will receive the following:

- 1) Quarterly newsletter, complete with up-to-date information on woodlot management, wood products from your area, and conservation information.
- 2) Information on Woodlot Management Plans, including planting, wildlife habitat enhancement, silviculture, selective harvesting techniques, recreation and soil and water conservation.
- 3) A chance to meet woodlot owners.
- 4) Participation in field days, demonstrations, conferences and meetings.
- 5) Information regarding assistance plans and incentive programs available to private woodlot owners through Manitoba Agro Woodlot Program and Manitoba Habitat Heritage Corporation.

Trees for the Environment

WAM's Trees for the Environment Program provides trees to association members for environmental (non-commercial) purposes only. Available trees may include white spruce seedlings, scotch pine seedlings, potted blue spruce (1 and 2 gallon) and fruit bearing shrubs. Members must include seedlings in a project to be eligible for the larger stock. A "care plot" for seedlings is recommended to allow transplanting after a few growth seasons. A maximum number of 3000 seedlings is allowed per applicant. A maximum number of 100 potted trees or fruit bearing shrubs is allowed per applicant.

The Trees for the Environment Program is a cooperative effort between Tree Plan Canada and the Province of Manitoba's Environmental Innovations Fund.

The Manitoba Forestry Association (MFA) (the field delivery program of the Canadian Forest Service portion of the Woodlot Program) has conducted educational activities since 1919, when the Tree Planting Car first crossed the prairies. As a non-political organization, the MFA plays an important role as a liaison among government, industry and the general public. The Association works in conjunction with the federal and provincial governments in tree planting and conservation activities, emphasizing education and public information.

Association activities include the following:

- 1) Conservation classes in schools
- 2) Sandilands, Interlake, Duck Mountain and Atikameg Forest Centres
- 3) Participation in Wildlife and Forest Weeks
- 4) Operation of a Forest Museum
- 5) Annual school poster contest
- 6) Promotion of tree planting for reforestation and as farm shelter belts
- 7) Production of Conservation Kits for teachers
- 8) Promotion of Smokey the Bear and wildfire prevention
- 9) Project Learning Tree
- 10) Heritage Trees of Manitoba

DUCKS UNLIMITED CANADA

The major program that may be of interest to woodlot owners is Manitoba Prairie CARE (Conservation of Agricultural Resources and Environment). The program is part of the Ducks Unlimited commitment to the North American Waterfowl Management Plan, and has a projected commitment of \$66.2 million over a 15 year period. The program has the following components:

- 1) Demonstrates and encourages land management practices having mutual benefits to soil conservation, farm economics and wildlife habitat.
- 2) Provides incentives for converting land marginally suited to agricultural production into wildlife habitat.
- 3) Secures limited acreages of key wildlife habitat associated with wetlands through purchase or long-term lease.
- 4) Provides technical assistance on request to local organizations and landowners wishing to combine waterfowl habitat benefits with soil conservation practices.

Manitoba Prairie CARE programs are targeted to 48 RMs in southwestern Manitoba's pothole region. Four groups of RMs currently (1993-94) are selected for priority: 1) Saskatchewan, Harrison, Odanah, Elton; 2) Shoal Lake, Rosburn, Hamiota, Strathclair, LGD Park South; 3) Archie, Wallace, Pipestone, Miniota, Woodworth; 4) Riverside, Strathcona, Argyle, Roblin, Turtle Mountain.

Agricultural demonstration projects and applications for habitat conversion and leasing will be considered from throughout the pothole habitat region in western Manitoba and adjacent to designated Heritage Marshes or Candidates. To be eligible, all projects should be associated with wetland areas having waterfowl production potential. The following assistance and incentives are offered:

- 1) Forage establishment assistance for lands associated with wetlands and not eligible under another program.
- 2) Forage management leases with payments to landowners who retire land from annual crop production or alter their management practices to provide wildlife benefits.
- 3) Material and technical assistance for planned grazing systems.
- 4) Technical and financial assistance to approved conservation farming demonstration projects.

CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

WHITEMUD WATERSHED CONSERVATION DISTRICT

The Whitemud Watershed Conservation District has a variety of forestry-related public programs available to assist private landowners within the District.

Field Shelterbelt Program

The Conservation District encourages the planting of shelterbelts for soil erosion control and moisture management. The District will supply trees, plough planting sites, apply chemical weed control, custom plant trees and assist weed control with cultivations. Landowners are asked to provide a cultivated planting site, place markers to indicate the shelterbelt location, assist with weed control, maintain plantings for 10 years, and protect plantings from livestock, chemical and fire damage. Costs are shared at 75% Conservation District and 25% landowner. A program variation, the Wildlife Habitat Shelterbelt, allows the District to plant a row of wildlife trees alongside a field shelterbelt.

Block Tree Planting Program

This program has the same criteria as the field shelterbelt program, but allows planting of an acreage to permanent tree cover for erosion control and wildlife enhancement. Landowner cost is \$87 per acre (1993).

Conservation Corridors

The Conservation Corridor program involves cooperation between the District and a municipality in order to preserve and restore natural habitat on unused road allowances. These corridors form natural shelterbelts which contribute to soil and water conservation, provide wildlife habitat, and provide recreational opportunities for people. The following steps are involved:

- 1) A representative of the District attends a meeting of the municipal council and gives a presentation explaining the program.
- 2) The council passes a resolution approving the implementation of the program.
- 3) The District conducts a survey to determine location and extent of developed and undeveloped road allowances.
- 4) The RM and District sign an agreement regarding respective roles and responsibilities.
- 5) The RM passes a by-law regarding the preservation of undeveloped road allowances.
- 6) The District assists the municipality in informing landowners about the program.
- 7) The District erects signs on all road allowances designated by the municipality as conservation corridors.

Wildland Preservation

This program is designed to maintain and conserve unique wildlands and wildlife habitat. The District and a landowner sign an agreement which states that a particular parcel of land will be preserved in its natural state. In return for the landowner's agreement that he will not permit the land to be damaged, the Conservation District agrees to erect signs along the boundaries of the wildlands project. Either parties to the agreement may withdraw from the agreement by giving 30 day's notice.

Boy Scouts Tree Planting

This is an environmental education program that involves tree planting on fragile escarpment lands.

CONSERVATION DISTRICTS - WHITEMUD CON'T

"Spruce it Up"

This program provides spruce trees for community based groups throughout the Conservation District.

Conservation Tree Program

Landowners within the Whitemud District may be provided a variety of tree species as part of a "greening campaign".

Schoolyard Tree Planting Program

Groups are assisted in planting tree shelter around schoolyards.

CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

PEMBINA VALLEY CONSERVATION DISTRICT

Centered on the Pembina River Valley and tributary streams, the Pembina Valley Conservation District (PVCD) serves all or portions of the Rural Municipalities of Louise, Pembina, Lorne and Thompson. The main communities encompassed in the District include Crystal City, Pilot Mound, Somerset, Miami and Manitou. PVCD is in a position to assist landowners in a variety of ways with woodlot programs:

Soil Management Programs

- 1) The PVCD will encourage landowners to plant and/or maintain perennial cover on marginal lands, through external or local funding programs.
- 2) The Board will support efforts by RMs to plant and maintain trees and natural vegetation on unused road allowances.
- 3) The Board will encourage many government agencies to reform existing policies that discourage conservation farming.

Water Management Programs

- 1) The PVCD will establish an incentive program for landowners who maintain buffer strips of permanent plant cover along streams, lakes and reservoirs.
- 2) Conservation of existing wetlands will be encouraged by involving Ducks Unlimited and other agencies that offer habitat leasing programs.
- 3) The Board will work to improve tax incentives for landowners who maintain areas of marshland, forest, grassland or shelterbelts.

Fish and Wildlife Programs

- 1) The Board is committed to preserving natural cover wherever a landowner is willing, acting through land leasing or purchase, or other incentive programs, on our own or in cooperation with national or international habitat agencies.
- 2) The Board stresses that maintenance of a healthy living system is essential to the health of the land.
- 3) Wildlife and fish habitat programs will be focused on improving conditions for native species.
- 4) The Board will encourage the protection and preservation of wildlife habitat on undeveloped road allowances.
- 5) The Board will cooperate with the local Wildlife Associations in the planning of any wildlife projects.

TURTLE RIVER WATERSHED CONSERVATION DISTRICT

This Conservation District includes the Turtle and Ochre River drainage areas, encompassing all of portions of the RMs of Ste. Rose du Lac, Ochre River, McCreary, Dauphin, Lawrence and Rosedale, and the LGD of Alonsa. District programs of interest to woodlot owners include the following:

Wildlife Incentive Program is a one-time payment of \$300 to set aside a Wildlife Conservation Area on private land. The District also provides signage for these areas for designation. There is no restrictions on the size of parcels of land.

The Tree Planting Program operates with local school groups. The trees are provided by either Canadian Forest Service or PFRA and the District provides the transportation and location for planting.

A Shelterbelt Establishment Program to assist farmers in establishing shelterbelts was being investigated in 1993.

TURTLE MOUNTAIN CONSERVATION DISTRICT

The Turtle Mountain Conservation District (TMCD) occupies an extensive area in the Turtle Mountains in southwestern Manitoba. Currently there are three types of tree programs for members of the District.

The shelterbelt program, developed originally in efforts to prevent wind erosion, was later found to provide other benefits like wildlife habitat and snow catchment. The belts are established and maintained for three years at a minimal cost to the landowners.

Two others programs, the Wildlands Conservation/Protection program, and the Habitat Initiatives were developed solely for the benefits of wildland development and protection. Part of the objective of these programs is recognizing or establishing woodlot areas for wildlife habitat. Landowners who apply for the Wildlands Conservation/Protection program are asked to set aside lands on a temporary basis (up to three years). In return, the District may provide a cash payment to help cover the tax costs. In the Habitat Initiatives program, landowners can develop their own habitat plans for their lands. Some plans in the past have included block tree planting and various tree belts with fruit bearing trees.

The soil management program encourages residents to maintain vegetation and crop residue cover. The District will undertake conservation and reclamation projects in cooperation with Ducks Unlimited, private landowners, municipalities, the Province and other groups. Wind erosion concerns involve encouraging landowners to maintain erodible soils under natural vegetative cover by requesting the Province to flag the lower assessed value of wooded areas and wetlands on tax notices, and encouraging landowners in verbal and written agreements to preserve land under natural vegetation cover.
