## **Introduction**

A significant amount of information has been and is being produced in the United States, Canada and Australia on a variety of issues related to fire management in the wildland/urban interface (WUI). This includes scientific papers, technical reports, brochures, newsletters, videos and other such reference materials. Individuals or organizations that are pursuing solutions to WUI problems often require background information before they can begin their projects; however, obtaining copies of all the available information can be a difficult and time consuming process. Therefore, a collection of nearly 400 primary WUI resource materials has been compiled at the Northern Forestry Centre (NoFC) in Edmonton, Alberta and is available for use by both organizations and the general public. The purpose of this document is to provide an explanation of how the WUI resource materials were assembled, to provide a bibliographic listing of the materials and to discuss how they can be accessed.

## **Assembling the Wildland/Urban Interface Resource Materials**

A variety of techniques were used to assemble the WUI resource materials listed in this document. These include: reviewing previously published bibliographies, conducting library searches, making direct contact with WUI related agencies and assessing literature citations in major WUI publications. It soon became obvious that it would be necessary to limit searches to resource materials that had a direct connection to the WUI because certain aspects of fire (e.g., fire behavior, weather, fuels, etc.) can be linked to almost all fields of fire management.

## Bibliographies

Two major WUI bibliographies have been published to date (Donoghue et al. 1989; National Fire Protection Association 1991). These bibliographies, which list many of the same materials, identified many of the technical reports and scientific articles that have now been compiled at NoFC. Two other major references that were utilized were the International Bibliography of Wildland Fire (Fire Research Institute 1991) and a catalogue produced by the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (1992) which lists many handbooks, guides, pamphlets and visual materials, some of which deal with WUI fire problems.

## Library Searches

To ensure that other WUI resource materials not identified in earlier bibliographies could be included in this data base, searches were conducted at the NoFC, University of Alberta, and Alberta Agriculture libraries. These searches involved the use of computerized and non-computerized catalogue systems. Searches, using keywords, were conducted on the Forestry Abstracts, Scientific Abstracts, AGRICOLA, and CAB data base systems.

After these major searches were completed it was apparent that certain periodicals were the primary sources of pertinent WUI literature. This includes:

- Fire Management Notes,
- Fire Technology,
- Journal of Forestry, and
- Wildfire News and Notes.

Other periodicals that occasionally had WUI related articles were:

- American Forests,
- Fire Command,
- Fire Journal,
- Forestry Chronicle,
- Landscape Planning,
- Journal of Soil and Water Conservation, and
- Western Wildlands.

Addresses for where these publications can be obtained are provided in Appendix 1.

## Direct Contacts

An initial list and the addresses of organizations from which WUI resource materials could be obtained directly was provided in Donoghue et al. (1989). However, this list excluded many fire and resource management agencies that were known to be pursuing WUI problems and so the list was expanded to include a majority of the wildland fire management agencies in

Canada, the US and Australia. A complete listing of the agencies contacted is shown in Tables 1, 2 and 3, and their addresses can be found in Appendix 2. Note that the majority of materials provided by the direct contacts were prevention and planning materials such as pamphlets, brochures and localized fire management plans.

#### Literature Citations of Major Wildland/Urban Interface Publications

One of the most effective ways to assemble data that may not be retrievable through a standard library search is to review the literature citations of major publications. In compiling the NoFC data base this was conducted using the publications listed in Appendix 3. This process identified many additional documents that have a direct link to WUI issues.

#### **Bibliography of Wildland/Urban Interface Resource Materials**

The bibliography of WUI resource materials compiled at NoFC consists of 391 references<sup>6</sup> (Appendix 4) that have been entered into a single library data base program. Each entry has the following fields:

- author(s) name(s),
- date of publication (if available),
- title,
- publishers name and location,
- call number,
- key words, and
- notes.

In developing the data base, the notes section was used to specify the general category of each entry (Table 4). Also the keywords section was used extensively to identify:

- (a) the location where the reference material was produced or pertains to (Table 5), and
- (b) the specific topics of each resource item (Table 6).

This data base format was used primarily to facilitate efficient data base searches and to provide as much information about each reference as possible.

## **Using the Wildland/Urban Interface Resource Material Data Base**

The software program used for the WUI resource material data base is a menu-driven package called Pro-cite (Personal Bibliographic Software 1988). It allows entries to be organized alphabetically and data can be retrieved using searches on any individual field or combinations of the fields. For example, if a person wanted to obtain a listing of all of the resource materials that relate to prevention and planning in California they could run a search on the keywords or notes fields or search the title for terms such as prevention, planning, or California. On the other hand, if a person only wanted to find all the WUI pamphlets or posters that were included in the NoFC collection they would simply have to run a keyword search on the notes field.

Access to the resource materials compiled at the NoFC fire library is available to all interested individuals and organizations. Reference materials can be viewed on-site or borrowed for a short period of time (e.g., 1-2 weeks)<sup>7</sup>. Copies of the Pro-cite data base can also be obtained upon request, by sending a blank formatted (MS-DOS) disk (3.5" or 5.25") to NoFC<sup>8</sup>. Unfortunately, NoFC staff will be unable to fill any phone or mail requests for copies of particular publications.

## **Concluding Remarks**

Even though a significant amount of information on the WUI has been compiled at the NoFC, we are certain that a great deal of resource materials have also been missed in our searches. Therefore, we would appreciate being informed of or receiving copies of materials that should be included in our reference library. Likewise, to keep the library current, we would also appreciate receiving any new publications or resource materials that are developed. Sharing information is one of the best techniques for enhancing the quality and effectiveness of new products and it is vital to the development of new strategies for dealing with the problems associated with fire management in the wildland/urban interface.
