WINTER INJURY IN LODGEPOLE PINE, PONDEROSA

PINE AND DOUGLAS-FIR IN THE ELKO - FERNIE

AREA, 1972

During the winter of 1971-72 semi-mature lodgepole pine from Elko to Fernie suffered moderate to heavy foliage damage as a result of winter injury. Spectacular foliage browning had occurred on south and west exposures between 3,500 and 4,500 feet elevation. Ponderosa pine and occasional Douglas-fir trees in the same general area sustained moderate and light damage respectively.

No extensive tree mortality is expected as a result of the winter damage. However, the weakened trees may be subject to attack by other pests.
