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1. General instructions

Supported by the Forest Innovation Program (FIP) of the Canadian Forest Service (CFS) of Natural Resources Canada (NRCan), the Canadian Wood Fibre Centre (CWFC) Fibre Solutions Program supports research, development, and technology transfer activities in support of the emerging bioeconomy to advance the Government of Canada priorities.

Please complete all sections of this Application in the language of your choice, English or French (application form is available in both official languages). Attachments, other than the letters of support, the Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility (IDEA) Questionnaire, and the IDEAPlan, will not be considered. Please respect the number of words required for each question. If you use acronyms, describe them at least once.

All project applications will be reviewed for completeness, eligibility, and relevance. See section 3 and 4 of the Application Guide for more information on the evaluation criteria that will be used to assess proposals and guide the overall allocation of funds.

There are three (3) options offered to you: you can apply for a one-year project, a two-year project or a three-year project.

- 1-year project: The project must run from 2023-24 and be completed by March 31, 2024;
- **2-year project**: The project must be carried out in 2023-24 and 2024-25, and completed by March 31, 2025;
- **3-year project**: The project must be carried out in 2023-24, 2024-25 and 2025-26, and completed by March 31, 2026.

CWFC overall research areas are structured around five Collaborative Research Projects (CRP):

- **CRP 1.1**: Characterize Provide tools and approaches to characterize forest biomass and wood attributes in order to optimize the value chain;
- CRP 1.2: Produce Fibre production to support the forest sector and the emerging bioeconomy;
- **CRP 2.1**: Anticipate High resolution tree and stand projections leveraging new technologies to increase precision and anticipate changes in future wood supply;
- **CRP 2.2**: Adapt Operational-scale silviculture research to improve resistance, resilience or transform forest stands, and to secure fibre production;
- **CRP 3.1**: Integrate Digitalization of the value chain to advance the digital transformation of the forest sector and support the emerging bioeconomy.

2023-26 Contribution Program Priority Research Areas:

Within the context of the foregoing CWFC research areas, the Fibre Solutions Contribution Program will focus on the following research priorities:

- 1. Adaptative Silviculture (forest management practices to increase adaptation to climate change impacts);
- 2. Forest Value Chain Optimization (digitalization; mapping potential supply, including post-harvest and salvage material);
- Traceability and Fibre Characterization (Knowledge, Tools, and Data including to match supply to product to support emerging bioeconomy);
- Forest Monitoring tools and techniques (Enhanced Forest Inventory (EFI), Big Data).
